



1. WATCH IT!

2. DO IT!

Activity

Hide-and-Seek-a-Toy

WHAT YOU NEED:


A small toy—like a small stuffed
animal or toy truck

WHAT YOU DO:

Say, "Let's play a game. I'll close my
eyes and count to ten. While I'm
counting, you hide the toy somewhere
in this room. Then, I have until you
count to ten to find it. If I can't find it,
you get a point. If I do find it, I get a
point! Then, we'll switch. I'll hide the
toy while you count with your eyes
closed. Let's do it!"

Take turns behind the "hider" and
the "seeker".

After a few rounds, add up the points
and see who won! Tell your child that
hiding things from each other for a
game can be fun. Ask them: "Who
should we always be honest with?"
(*God. We don't need to hide anything
from God.*)



3. TALK ABOUT IT!

Talk about the Bible Story

Do you ever talk or pray to God? What are some
things you tell God? (*Share with your child. If not, talk
about how you talk and pray to God.*)

Look up 1 John 1:9 (NIV) and read it together.

What does it mean to sin? Why should we tell God
about it? (*We sin when we do something we know we
shouldn't. Everyone sins—moms and dads, included.
God wants us to tell Him when we've sinned so that
He can forgive us.*)

Once we confess our sins, does that mean we won't
do wrong things again? (*No, we are humans and we
aren't perfect. God knows we can't obey Him perfectly
and He still wants us to talk to Him about everything
including when we mess up or disobey Him.*)

How does confessing our sins and being truthful keep
us close to God? (*When we're truthful with God, we
remember that He sent Jesus to make it possible for
us to have a forever relationship with Him.*)

Is there anything you need to tell God about right
now? Let's pray silently for a moment and talk to God.

Prayer

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about
the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"Dear God, thank You for loving us. Thank You for
sending Jesus. Because of Him, nothing can separate
us from You. God, sometimes we try to hide things from
You. But You are interested in everything about us, and
that is AMAZING to think about! We ask You to remind
us to share our lives with You—because You love us.
We love You, too! We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen."

Integrity means choosing to be truthful in whatever you say and do.

DAY
1

Build Something Strong

Grab some stackable materials. Start stacking one item right on top of the other and see how tall you can get the tower before it falls over. After it falls, start again. But this time create a stronger foundation by putting more blocks on the bottom and working your way up. Just like building a strong foundation for your tower, always speaking the truth sets a good foundation for your relationships with friends and family!

Know that when you build your life on truth you will have stronger relationships with God and those around you.

3

The Good, The Bad, The Ugly

Yesterday, you wrote a list of things that you can talk to God about. Go grab that list. Talk to God about some of the things on that list. Choose one from each of these categories: Good (something good happening in your life), Bad (something that you need help with), Ugly (a time that you may have hurt someone's feelings by lying or being unkind.) Pray something like this filling in the blanks with what's on your list:

"Dear God, Thank you so much for (the good). Help me (the bad). And God, please forgive me for (the ugly). Thank you for loving me and forgiving me no matter what. I love you, amen."

Thank God for always forgiving you.

DAY
2

You Are Forgiven!

Did you know that you can talk to God about anything? Even when we have done something wrong we can ask God to forgive us! If you say something unkind to a friend or if you cheat in a game you can ask God to forgive you. He will always forgive you! Today, think about things that you can tell God. Write them down so you can remember them for tomorrow's activity.

Look for times in your life that you need to talk to God.

4

Heart Eyes!

Look up this week's verse, Matthew 5:8. Read it a few times and then grab some paper, scissors, something to write with, and glue or tape.

Create some heart glasses. Cut two heart shapes out of paper to use as the glasses part and three strips to create the nose bridge and the arms of the glasses. Glue or tape all pieces together. Say the verse with your new glasses on! Use these glasses to remind you that those who are pure in heart will see God!

Look for ways that you can see God.
