2nd-3rd Grade Activities for March 29 – April 4th

I Don't Want to Miss a Thing

Bible Story: I Don't Want to Miss a Thing (Father and Older Brother) • *Luke 15:21-32* **Bottom Line:** When you don't forgive, you miss out.

Memory Verse: Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. Colossians 3:13 (NIV) Life App: Forgiveness—Deciding that someone who has wronged you doesn't have to pay Basic Truth: I should treat others the way I want to be treated.

2. Bible Story Review Questions –

Talk about the choices the older brother in our story made today.

- How did the father react when his son returned? (*He forgave him and threw a huge party to celebrate his son's return*)
- Where was the older brother when the younger son returned? (Working in the field)
- How did the older brother react when he found out that the party was for his younger brother who'd returned home? (*He was angry*)
- What did the older brother say to the father? ("All these years I have worked, I've obeyed. You've never thrown me a party.")
- Why do you think the older brother was SO mad? Can you relate to this?
- Why do you think the father celebrated in such a big way?

3. Conversation Suggestions –

What You Say:

"I can relate to the older brother in this story. He's right; he was the one who had stayed, the one who worked hard and honored his dad. But he missed out. Because he thought it was more important to be right than to forgive, he missed the opportunity to celebrate his brother's return. Sometimes we do the same thing. We want to make a point or prove that we're right and the other person is wrong. But in the end, your friendship is WAY more important than winning an argument. We need to offer forgiveness when someone apologizes and means it. Because *[Bottom Line]* when you don't forgive, you miss out."

"The older brother missed out on a super fun party. Why? Because, unlike his father, he refused to forgive. What could we miss out on when we refuse to forgive? (*Pause for responses.*) Refusing to forgive could cause you to miss out on a friendship! One thing that's super important to remember is that NO one is perfect. We all mess up sometimes. We all say things we don't really mean or do things that hurt others. Hopefully when that happens, like in the story Jesus told, the other person apologizes. And in that case, we should offer forgiveness for sure. Remember, **[Bottom Line] when you don't forgive, you miss out."**

[Make It Personal] (Tell kids about a time when you refused to forgive someone as a kid and you missed out. What happened as a result of choosing to stay mad?)

4. Memory Verse Building

What You Need: Large popsicle sticks, a Bible, "Memory Verse Phrases", scissors, glue stick

What You Do:

- Ask your child to open the Bible to Colossians 3:13 and read it aloud.
- Give them a set of "Memory Verse Phrases," seven popsicle sticks, glue, and scissors.
- Instruct them to cut out the phrases and glue each one onto a popsicle stick.
- When finished, encourage your kid to stack their sticks any way they choose to "build" the verse.

What You Say:

"Forgiveness is important! And we know that's true because God is the ultimate forgiver! This verse is such a great one to remember always. You can use these sticks and build this verse over and over again as you remember to forgive as God forgives you. Let's choose to forgive and fix the relationships with the people around us, with God's help. Because **[Bottom Line]** when you don't forgive, you miss out."

"Heavenly Father, thank You for always offering forgiveness to us, just like the father in this story Jesus told. When we feel like holding onto anger like the older brother, would you please help us choose to forgive instead? We definitely need Your help to do that. We love and trust You, God. In Jesus' name we pray, amen."
