Bible Story Review]


- Ask kids what they think was the most important thing the men on road to Emmaus discovered.
- Ask what THEY (the kids) discovered from this story.
- [Make It Personal] (Share something you recently discovered about God as you listened to a sermon or podcast, read your Bible, discussed your faith with someone, or another way God opened your eyes to something new.)

What You Say:

[Bottom Line] There's always more to discover about God's plan. We're always learning and finding new ways to live for Him. Just like Jesus helped the men in the story better understand God's plan, He's doing that for us, too. As followers of Jesus, we never quit discovering more about God and the plans He has for our lives. So keep listening, reading, praying, and talking to those who love God. Like the men on the road to Emmaus, you'll be amazed at what you learn."

What You Need: Bible

What You Do:

Gather together in a circle.

• Briefly review the concept of humility—



Look up and read Philippians 2:3 –



- Read (or recite) the verse again but replace one word with a handclap.
- The rest of the group must guess the missing word.
- Pass the Bible and repeat the process until everyone has had a turn.
- For an extra challenge, hold the Bible upside down as they read.

What You Say:

"You've done a great job learning an important verse. The Bible is full of promises, commands, and encouragement. *[Bottom Line]* There's always more to discover about God's plan and how to follow Him in the Bible. As we wrap up the month and our study of humility, let's say Philippians 2:3 together one more time as a final challenge."

5. PRAYER ACTIVITY

What You Need: Paper strips to make a paper chain, tape, glue or stapler.

What You Do:

- Set out the paper strips and show how to link them together to make a chain.
- On each strip, ask them to write one thing they have discovered this month about humility or something they learned about God.
- When their chain is complete, let them hang their chain somewhere to remind them of their discoveries from the month.
- Use the conversation below to guide them in prayer.

What You Say:

"Let your paper chain remind you that **[Bottom Line]** there's always more to discover about God's plan. Just like the circle of paper clips has no end, the things we can discover about life and God go on and on as well. Let's pray and ask God to help us choose to put others first and to keep discovering more about how to live for Jesus.

"Dear God, like the men who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus, we want to always be eager to learn more. They knew a lot about You, and so do we, but none of us know everything. Help us to discover more about You every day. In Jesus' name, amen."

HUMILITY





PUTTING OTHERS FIRST BY GIVING UP WHAT YOU THINK YOU DESERVE





READ PSALM 143:10

What is the very first word of today's verse?

King David, who wrote these words, isn't asking God to teach him some fun facts or information. He's asking God to teach him to be obedient, to do what God wants, instead of going his own way. David faced a lot of tough stuff in his life. In this Psalm to God David humbly asks God for help in following Him so that he can avoid making big mistakes.

When we disobey God and go our own way, we face some not so awesome consequences. David knew that God's way was better. Just like David, when we discover how God wants us to live and we follow His way in obedience, we'll be on the smoothest path for sure.

The next time you're riding in the car and you hit a bump in the road, remember this verse. Ask God to teach you to do His will knowing that He will lead you on level path, even through the bumps of life.



READ PSALM 25:4

DAY 2

To teach means to show or to explain how to do something. As an elementary kid, you know a thing or two about teachers. Good teachers make learning fun; they care about you and they challenge you along the way. The fact that you can read these words right now is probably because a teacher taught you how to read. Your heavenly Father also wants to teach you. God loves you and wants to show you His plan for your life. But just like you have to listen and pay attention in order to learn from your teachers at school, you have to listen to God. Reading God's word, praying to God, and talking about Him with your friends and leaders at church are all great ways to listen to God and learn how He wants you to live.

Every time you pick up a pencil at school or at home this week, say these words to God: "Teach me how to follow you." God wants to help you follow Him with humility, understanding that there's always something new to learn.

Read Psalm 25:5

DAY 3

Humility is understanding who God is. It's trusting God's way and following Him instead of thinking our way is best. It's recognizing that as we grow in our relationship with God, there is always something new to learn.

In today's verse, David asked God for two things: To guide and to teach. You could pray these words just as David did. Why? Because God is your Savior. He sent His only son to rescue you so that you could have a relationship with Him forever. We can put our hope in God, when? Only in the morning? Afterschool? Nope, all day long.

Grab four sticky notes. Write each sentence of Psalm 25:5 on a separate note. Then, stick your notes on four different clocks or in four different places around your house where you spend time. Each time you read a phrase this week, ask God to teach you how to follow Him, knowing there's always something new to discover.





Read Psalm 25:9

DAY 4

Have you ever watched a Charlie Brown cartoon on TV? In the show, the adults have these sort of "wahwah" sounding voices. George Shultz, who created the Peanuts comic, wanted to focus on Charlie Brown and his friends, so he chose an instrument to replace all the adult voices in the cartoon. Can you guess the instrument he chose?

Write your answer here:

Did you guess a trombone? Because you can't talk to God face to face, you might think that hearing from Him is like trying to listen to Charlie Brown's teacher. But hearing from God isn't complicated. You can hear from God every time you open His word.

Learning from God requires humility. He shows those who aren't proud how to do what is right. Because God is in control of all things, we need to trust that His way is better than our way. We have to put Him first, knowing there is always something new we can discover about Him.

Ask an adult to help you find a trombone sound on the computer. As you listen, say the words "Teach me your way" as a prayer to God. Humbly ask for His help so you can do what is right.
