






BIBLE STORY Hebrews 11:1-12:3

SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES:

1. WATCH VIDEOS (link is on the church website)

Bible Story Review:

- By faith, this person left his home and went to a place God told him.
 (Abraham)
- By faith, this person built a boat to save his family.
 - (Noah)
- By faith, this person defeated a giant.
 - (David)
- By faith, this person's parents hid him for three months after he was born.
 (Moses)
- \circ $\,$ By faith, this person brought two of every kind of animal into the ark.
 - (Noah)
- By faith, this king trusted God to keep him safe. He wrote, "The Lord is my shepherd. He gives me everything I need."
 - (David)
- By faith, this person believed that God would give him more kids and grandkids than the stars in the sky.
 - (Abraham)
- o By faith, this person stood before Pharaoh and said, "Let my people go!"
 - o (Moses)

What You Say:

"Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David couldn't see with their eyes how God was going to save His people, but they chose to have faith that one day God would send a special Rescuer. Who is that Rescuer? (*Pause.*) Yes, Jesus!

"Did you know that **[Bottom Line] you can know Jesus even though you've never seen Him?** (*Pause.*) Yes! You can know Him because of the true stories people tell about Him. You can know Him because you can read about Him in the Bible.

"You can have faith because people like Noah, Abraham, Moses, and David had faith. You can have faith that God sent Jesus to love you, to make a way for you to have a relationship with Him, and to show you how to love God and love others. So, remember, *[Bottom Line]* you can know Jesus even though you've never seen Him!"

3. Memory Verse Activity -What You Can't Can See



What You Need: Bibles, art or copy paper, leaves (spread beneath copy paper), crayons with the wrappers removed, tape to hold copy paper in place

What You Do:

• Distribute the Bibles and help kids look up the verse using the navigation tips below.

Finding verses with kindergartners: Guide kids to open the Bibles to the marked page. Point to the word "Hebrews" at the top of the page as you say, "Hebrews.". Then, guide kids to find the big number "11" on the page. Explain that this is the chapter number. Finally, guide them to look under the big "11" for the little "1;" this is the verse number. Tell them to leave their finger on the verse as you read it aloud. Then, lead everyone to say the verse together.

Finding verses with 1st *graders:* Guide kids to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (*Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show kids what the page looks like.*) When kids find the table of contents, lead them to find Hebrews in the list under "New Testament." You can help by telling them that Hebrews starts with the letters H-E-B. When kids find Hebrews, lead them to look at the page number beside the word. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find Hebrews. Help kids find the page. When they find Hebrews, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find chapter 11. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find verse 1 in chapter 11. Read the verse aloud. Then lead everyone to say the verse together.

- Use the conversation below as a guide to unpack the phrase "sure of what we do not see."
- Show kids how they can rub the side of a crayon over the art paper to find some hidden items.

In art lingo, rubbings are called *frottage [fraw-tahzh]*: creating an image by rubbing a crayon, chalk, pencil, charcoal, etc. over a textured surface.

What You Say:

"Wow, look what you found! Those are beautiful leaves! Even though you couldn't see the leaves before you started coloring, were they still there? (*Yes!*) What are some other things that are real even though you can't see them? (*Kids may be stuck for ideas at first, and that's OK. Get the conversation started with a few examples, like wind or our hearts.*)

"Hebrews 11:1 tells us that '*Faith* is being sure of what we hope for. It is being sure of what we do not see.' We can't see God with our eyes, but can we be sure that God is real? (*Yes!*) How can we be sure? (*We can see the world He made. We can believe what the Bible says about Him. We can hear people talk about Him.*)

"You can have faith in Jesus even though you've never seen Him. When you see the world He's made, when you read the Bible, and when you hear people tell about Him, you can know Him even though you've never seen Him. We say it this way: *[Bottom Line]* you can know Jesus even though you've never seen Him.

"You may not understand all of this now, and that's OK. But if you'd like to talk about what it means to believe in Jesus, you can talk to me, one of the other *(name of your environment)* leaders, a parent, or someone you know who follows Jesus. We'll be happy to help you understand as much as you can. Just remember: *[Bottom Line]* you can know Jesus even though you've never seen Him!"





5. Pray together

What You Say:

"FAITH is all about believing in the things you can't see because you start with what you CAN see. We can't see God with our eyes, but we CAN see the stories of people who came before us. They chose to trust God's promise that He would send a Rescuer to make everything right again. Who is that Rescuer? (*Pause.*) Yes, JESUS!

[Make It Personal] (Tell kids how you came to trust Jesus as your Savior.)

"You may not understand all of this now, and that's OK. But if you'd like to talk with someone about what it means to believe in Jesus and follow Him, you can talk with me, another leader, or someone you know who follows Jesus.

"But no matter what, always, remember that God loves you more than you can imagine and that He wants you to know Him! Let's pray."

Lead in prayer, thanking God for sending Jesus to be our Savior. Ask God to help your familyyou're your loved ones to know Him more.
