



Acts 10

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SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES:

1. WATCH VIDEOS (link is on the church website)

Story Review:

1) What appeared to Cornelius as he prayed?

(An angel appeared to him in a vision)

2) What did Peter see in his vision?

(He saw a sheet filled with animals which God said he could eat.)

- 3) Why was it strange that God sent Peter to Cornelius' house?

 (Cornelius wasn't a Jew. It was against the law for Jews to go into the houses of non-Jews.)
- 4) What was God telling Peter?

(That He loves all people and wants everyone to know about Him.)

What You Say:

"In today's Bible story, we heard how God helped Peter understand that He was making new rules so Jewish people and non-Jewish people could interact. Before this story, a Jew wasn't allowed to go to someone's house if they weren't also Jewish. So, Peter stepping inside Cornelius' house was a huge deal. He trusted that God was doing something new—that the good news of Jesus was for everyone. Despite what other Jews would think, Peter boldly continued to share the story of Jesus with everyone. Because he did, the story kept spreading and spreading, until eventually, someone told me, and now we're hearing it together! [Bottom Line] Knowing Jesus changes the way you see others."

[Make it Personal] (Share about a time when God changed how you responded to someone who was different than you or someone who got on your nerves, because He changed how you saw them or because you became more aware that they are made in God's image, too.)

What You Do:

- Recite this month's verse, Hebrews 11:1.
- Find all of the words from this month's verse and circle them.
- As they work, engage them in conversation about the verse and this summer's Life App of faith.
 - If faith is believing in what you can't see because of what you can see, what are some things you can see (or hear, feel, experience) that help you know Jesus is real? (My church, the love of my family and friends, nature)
 - o What's one thing you learned this month about God's story?

What You Say:

"God told Peter that he should give others a chance. And Peter had faith in God, and obeyed what God asked Him to do. He found people to share the story of Jesus with! It's important to find people in your life to give them a chance to hear God's story. **[Bottom Line]** Knowing Jesus changes the way you see others. Think of someone who you might need to see differently. Ask God to change how you see that person, then make the effort to show them that Jesus loves them!"

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



5. PRAY TOGETHER

What You Say:

[Bottom Line] Knowing Jesus changes the way you see others.

"As your relationship with and faith in Jesus grow, you start using your 'Jesus' lens to see others. Instead of ignoring someone that you think is different, difficult, or annoying, you might see an opportunity to be kind and loving toward them. Take a moment to think of two people you might need to see differently. Let's pray and ask God to change how you see them.

Pray:

"Dear God, we are so grateful that You sent Your Son, Jesus, to die for every person You ever created so that they can have the opportunity for a relationship with You. Help us put on our 'Jesus' lens this week to see others differently. Help us learn to love them like You do. In Jesus' name, amen."

READ COLOSSIANS 3:9-11

DAY 1

Go find the darkest pair of sunglasses you have—maybe you can even borrow some from your mom or dad. Put them on inside and notice how it makes everything look so much closer to the same color. Putting on the glasses gives you a new perspective and makes everything look pretty similar.

Just like today, when Jesus was on the earth, people weren't always great about loving everyone and realizing that everyone is equally loved by God. But Jesus showed us what it means to love each other by the way He treated everyone—Pharisee and sinner, Jew and Gentile, adult and child—the same. And when we follow Jesus, we will see others the way He does: with love for all.

Listen to what God says about His children: we are equal in His sight.

READ EPHESIANS 4:32

DAY 2

Jesus came to be your Savior, but He also came to be the Savior of your best friend, your little brother, your mom, and yes, even your enemy. Remembering that God lovesY Nand sent His Son to die forV can change how you view EO It means you need to forgive R, and be kind to E E.

READ ROMANS 12:10

DAY 3

Knowing Jesus changes the way you see others, and the way you see yourself too. Instead of seeing yourself as the most important, you realize you should put others first.

All day today, put your focus on others. Instead of taking the bathroom first, let your sister have the mirror. When you want the last bowl of cereal, let your brother have first dibs instead. Instead of waiting for your mom to remind you to pick up your dirty clothes, put them in the hamper on your own.

Ask God to help you see others as worthy of honor.

READ 1 PETER 2:17

DAY 4

Did you put others first all day yesterday? How did it feel to show honor and respect to others and put them first, ahead of your own desires?

There's a popular phrase that says "humility isn't thinking less of your self, but thinking of your self less." That's kind of tricky to understand, but the idea is that you don't need to think badly of your self to think highly of others—you just need to think of them more often.

Grab a dry erase marker and write this on your bathroom mirror, starting with really big letters on "God" and ending with very little letters on "me."
