



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SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES:

2. <u>TALK ABOUT</u> Watercolor Scripture

What You Need: Watercolor paints, art paper, "Scripture Strips" (Next Page), glue.

What You Do:

- Print and cut out "Scripture Strips."
- Choose a strip to read the scripture about heaven then use their watercolor paints to illustrate that verse any way they choose.
- Kids can use the glue sticks to glue their "Scripture Strip" to the page.

What You Say:

"Your painting is beautiful. Jesus gave John a vision of heaven and he wrote down what he saw. God will make ALL things right in the end. We can be with Him forever in a place that's more wonderful, more amazing, more mind-blowingly awesome than we can imagine! And while we may not know everything there is to know about heaven, we can know for sure that **[Bottom Line]** following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine."

[Make it Personal] (Select your favorite scripture from the "Scripture Strips" the kids illustrated. Tell kids why this promise is your favorite. Remind them, that while there are things we don't know about heaven, God has made it very clear that the way to heaven is by trusting Jesus and that [Bottom Line] following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine.)

"My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?" John 14:2, NIV

"Then I saw "a new heaven and a new earth," for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea." Revelation 21:1, NIV

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God." Revelation 21:3, NIV

"He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." Revelation 21:4, NIV


"The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and the Lamb is its lamp." Revelation 21:23, NIV

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3. <u>MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY</u> -



What You Need: Hula hoop, hop scotch, jump rope, or any other physical activity (ie: jumping jacks or run in place) to do while reciting this months vers. grid "Verse Word Labels" (Activity Page), and Bibles

What You Say:

"We've been learning this month that faith is trusting in what you can't see because of what you can see. Jesus left heaven to come to Earth. He walked and talked, healed and helped, died and rose again so that we could be saved. What Jesus did for us allows us to have a relationship with God, forever. It's not based on what we do or don't do. Jesus made a way for us to have a relationship with God! **[Bottom Line]** Following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine."

4. PRAY TOGETHER

What You Need: Paintings from "Watercolor Scripture"

What You Do:

- Let them hold their watercolor paintings as they pray silently, thanking God for the promise that *[Bottom Line]* following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine.
- After a few minutes, close out your time with a prayer.

What You Say:

"Heavenly Father, thank You for sending Jesus so that we can know You. We want to follow Jesus, always. Thank You for the promise that one day, You will make all things right and perfect. And help us to follow You, every day knowing that **[Bottom Line]** following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine."

READ ECCLESIASTES 3:11-14

Get a sheet of paper and draw the most amazing place you can imagine. It might be a real place, or it could be something you completely make up . . . like a real-life Candy Land. If you have time, go all out with markers and colored pencils and even glitter or stickers. Leave the paper blank on the other side and hold on to it for tomorrow.

No matter how awesome your imaginary land might be, it can't come close to what God says heaven will be like. As much as we want to imagine how things will turn out in the end, we simply can't imagine how great heaven and living with God forever will be!

Know that following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine!

READ JOHN 14:2-3

Grab your sheet of paper from yesterday, where you drew the most amazing place. Flip it over and now draw your dream room. What color would the walls be? Would you line it with bookshelves or display cases for your LEGO[®] creations? Would you have a bunk bed or maybe a canopy? Now think about who your roommate might be in this dream scenario—or your next-door neighbor. Maybe your parents are just down the hall, but your best friend is in the bottom bunk.

AN OPEN LETTER TO THE FUTURE THERAPIST OF MY CHILDREN

Dear therapist who may one day be counseling my children,

There are two things I need to say right out of the gate:

1. I tried my best.

2. I hope you have a sound machine.

The second point is more of a personal preference rather than a revelation. Having gone to counseling myself, I appreciate when a therapist has some sort of sound machine that makes you feel like you're at the beach. Gentle electronic waves lapping against the shore tend to help you forget you're actually in a strip mall off the highway. The second point is easy to address, the first point is a little more detailed.

I did try my best as a parent, but I know my kids are going to have many, many things to tell you about someday. They will sit on a couch and regale you with stories from their childhoods. Some will make you laugh. We put a high price on humor in our family, and laughter often filled the halls of our home.

Some stories will be gross. Ask them about the time we thought a squirrel had died within our walls. Turns out it was a year-old ostrich egg that had cracked undetected in a decorative bowl. The smell was like getting punched in the face by a vengeful bird from another continent.

Other stories will not be as funny, and you will quickly discover something I had to admit a few years into the adventure of parenting. I am not perfect. I tried to be for the first few years. I promise I did. But all too often . . .

I was impatient with my kids.

I lost my temper over things that didn't really matter.

I discouraged when I should have encouraged or encouraged when I should have been more realistic.

I gave them bad advice.

I took some things too seriously and others too casually.

I chased after my work instead of after them. I was on the road traveling for business, trying to be somebody when I already was somebody . . . A dad. A father. And in this case, a launch pad for some therapist's new boat.

Tell my kids I love them. That I'm so proud I got to be their dad. Tell them parenting involves a lot of mistakes, and forgiveness, and messiness, and laughter. Tell them I'll pick up the bill for your work—which I assume might be high, depending on the quality of sound machine you've got.
