Please Forgive Me

Bible Story: Please Forgive Me (The Story of the Lost Son) • Luke 15:11-24
Bottom Line: Everyone needs to be forgiven.
Memory Verse: Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. Colossians 3:13 (NIV)
Life App: Forgiveness—Deciding that someone who has wronged you doesn't have to pay
Basic Truth: I can trust God no matter what.

2. Do Activity: "Follow The Maze"

3. Draw the Different Story Scenes:

- 1. The father gave the son all of his inheritance.
- 2. The son left home and spent all his money.
- 3. The son ended up eating with pigs.
- 4. The son decided to go back home. The father saw his son coming home and ran toward him to give him a hug.
- 5. The son asked for forgiveness.

4. Suggested Conversation:

"What are some things that kids your age might need to be forgiven for? (*Encourage responses, such as: telling a lie, disobeying my parents, yelling at my brother for messing up a video game, using my sister's stickers without asking, etc.*) Those are the kind of things we all do sometimes, and they're things we need to ask forgiveness for. Some of those things might also be done TO us, and we need to forgive the other person, even if we're angry and even if they don't ask for forgiveness. **[Bottom Line] Everyone needs to be forgiven.**"

[Make It Personal] (Tell about a child-appropriate time when you made the decision to forgive someone even when it was hard. Tell how that grew your relationship with God.)

What You Say:
