

# **Sermon Discussion Guide**

October 16th, 2022

Use this discussion guide with your small group or by yourself, to dig into the text and theme of Sunday's message.

Key Point: God calls us to bear the cross so that we might bear fruit in His Kingdom.

# **Life Sharing: (answer one)**

- 1. What is your experience in life with growing things plants, vegetables, pets, kids, etc.?
- 2. Think about your morning routine. If you had to give up one part of that routine, what would you stop doing?

### **Transition / Open in prayer:**

3. Tell us about a time in your life when you were praying hard for someone else. Why were you praying for them?

#### Life Examination:

READ Colossians 1:1-18

- 4. What is it about the church in Colossi that impresses Paul?
- 5. What is the fruit of the gospel (verse 6)? What does it look like and what does it feel like?
- 6. Paul states many things they are praying for the followers of Jesus in Colossi in verses 9-14. List what they are praying for. Why are they praying these things for them?
- 7. What makes Jesus supreme, from Paul's perspective?

## READ Jeremiah 23:1-8

- 8. Who are the shepherds Jeremiah is writing about?
- 9. How have these shepherds not carried for the sheep, the people of Israel?
- 10. What will the new Shepherd, the King, do to change the story for the people of Israel?
- 11. What is the significance of the new story Jeremiah mentions in verses 7-8?

# **Life Application:**

- 12. What kinds of things do people grow in their lives? What do you notice growing in your life these days?
- 13. Why does God choose to work through people to bring good news instead of just taking care of it Himself?
- 14. Just to be clear, who is the Shepherd and the King that Jeremiah is writing about in chapter 23? How do you know?
- 15. What is the new story of deliverance in your life that shows the movement of God's Kingdom? (story of deliverance = a story of hope, change, faith that illustrates God's work in your life)
- 16. What are you having a hard time trusting God with these days?

**Life Prayers**: Pray for one another and ask God for power to surrender your lives to Jesus.
