Hello Kindergarten and First Grade Parents!





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SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES:

1. WATCH VIDEOS (link is on the church website)

The man from Ethiopia had some questions for Philip. We all have lots of questions. Some are about stuff that's not super important like, 'What's a scroll?' But other questions are very important, like the ones the man asked Philip about the Bible and God. If you have questions about the Bible and God and Jesus, you can always ask me, or another older person at church who you trust.

"God wants us to ask questions, and He wants to answer them! And how does He answer them? In His Word—the Bible. *[Make It Personal] (Tell kids about a question you had about God or the Bible, and how you found the answer in God's Word.)* You might not always get a specific answer to your question in the Bible, but you can *[Bottom Line]* keep going even when you have questions. Keep going, keep learning about God, and keep asking those questions!"

3. Memory Verse Activity – Don't Give Up

What You Need: "Memory Verse" Activity (next page), crayons

What You Do:

- Point out that the words "don't give up" are larger than the rest.
- Explain that "don't give up" means the same thing as "keep going," which has been in every Bottom Line this month, including this week's: **[Bottom Line] Keep going even when you have questions.**
- Tell kids to trace over the words "don't give up" and color their pages.
- While they work, encourage them to finish this sentence, "Don't give up when"
 - Responses could range from "you can't do your math homework" to "your brother is mad at you" to "you haven't scored a single goal in soccer."

What You Say:

"Don't give up! That's an important thing for us to remember when we don't want to keep going including when we don't want to keep going in doing good, as our verse talks about. Don't give up when things seem impossible. Don't give up when life gets tough. Don't give up when you're nervous because you don't know the end of the story. And don't give up when you have questions!"

5. Pray together

What You Do:

- Quietly think about things they need determination for right now. It could be something they've talked about earlier this month or something new.
- Give space for them to pray out loud about those things if they want to.
- Finish with the prayer below.

What You Say:

"Dear God, we thank You so much for giving us the ability to have determination and keep going. I want to ask you to help [kid's name] keep going when [thing that kid prayed for] and for all the other prayers that were prayed silently. Help us to keep going in all things, and especially to keep going even when we have questions. We love You so much, God. Amen."

Keep Going

Deciding

Have you ever heard of a guy named Abraham Lincoln? If you haven't yet, you will soon! He was the lóth President of the United States. But you know what? Becoming President didn't come easy. He failed a lot before he was finally successful and became our President. Ask an adult to help you read about all the failures that eventually led to Abraham Lincoln becoming an amazing President. Do you think he questioned whether he was doing the right thing? Of course, he did and all those failures along the way prepared him to be the President that he was. It's the same for all of us. The hard stuff that we might have questions about now, help us to become who God wants us to be.

Pop That Question

Ask an adult to help you look up our Bible story this week in Acts 8:26-40. How cool is it that God used Philip to answer questions that the man had about faith? God puts people in our lives to help answer the questions that we have, too. Grab some latex balloons, small pieces of paper, and a pencil. On each piece of paper, write a question that you have, stick it inside a balloon and blow it up. Place the balloons around your room and each day, pop one and find someone to ask one of your questions! After you make your balloons, take some time to pray this prayer.

Dear God,

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worth it to finish what you started

I am so grateful that You put people in my life that I can ask questions. Give me the courage to ask people the questions I have. I love you. Amen.

I Have A Question!

Have you ever been in school and there's something you don't understand? What do you have to do? You have to ask questions to help you understand. There are people in our lives that we can trust to ask hard questions. We're not ever going to know everything but when we ask questions it's like giving us a piece to a puzzle. Take a minute and think about the people in your life that you can trust to ask hard questions about life and faith. Flip over this sheet and see if you can cut out all the puzzle pieces and put them back together!

Know that we can keep going even when we have questions!
